### *From the Interim Rector*

This is my final article for the newsletter since my last Sunday at St. Michael's will be September 14<sup>th</sup>. On that Sunday, we will celebrate all that we have accomplished together, shared together, prayed together, laughed and cried together and the joy in the new ministry that is about to begin with The Rev. Sarah Robbins-Cole.

It has been a wonderful journey and I cherish every moment that we have shared. So much has happened in the short time that I have been with you. The vestry has created a mission statement to guide your life together and the decisions that you make. They have also created a way to support a ¾ time rector by how they engage the ministries and people. Together we have looked at ways to engage more people in ministries that they enjoy; the vestry has found a way to have more transparent and regular All Parish Community Meetings so that the parish has a time to hear what is going on in the life of the parish and ask questions so all of the parish is engaged in moving the parish into the future. St. Michael's is a vibrant and growing church and all are welcomed to be part of the excitement. The first parish gathering will be September 28<sup>th</sup> after the 10 a.m. service.

We have created both a Finance Committee and a Building and Grounds Committee as well as continuing the important ministries such as Outreach, Pastoral Care, Christian Formation, Altar Guild, Choir and all of the worship teams that serve on Sunday morning. All are important to meet the needs of a growing church, and St. Michael's is growing. We welcomed and integrated a total of 8 new individuals or families in the last year.

We have experienced different liturgies; Blue Christmas, Christmas Eve Family Service, Palm Sunday and Easter Vigil and have used the different Eucharistic Prayers from both the BCP and Enriching our Worship, and in the very near future you will be blessing new white vestments and altar hangings that the altar guild has been able to purchase through two generous donations.

We have called Jarvis Wyche as Youth Minister for the Journey to Adulthood Program, and expanded the team of teachers for our younger members. We sent Matthew off with a good good-bye and we wish him every blessing as he pursues his dreams at Mannes in New York City. An interim organist, Beverly Scheibert will join us in September.

All of this is important and necessary but I most cherish the opportunities that you have given me to walk with you through the joys, challenges and sorrows of your life. You have invited me into your lives and it has been an honor and privilege, and I thank you from the bottom of my heart for your trust and for the ways you have allowed me to become part of this wonderful community. I will miss you and you will always be in my prayers. We have done good work together and the result is a successful search process that led to the call of Rev. Sarah and I am so happy for what you and Rev. Sarah will accomplish together.

I'd like to share a blessing with you that Nan Malone offered to the vestry at our August meeting.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

It is with the very greatest pleasure that the Rector Search Committee and the Vestry of St. Michael's Church jointly report to you on the successful conclusion of the discernment process to call our next rector, and the acceptance of the call by **The Reverend Sarah Robbins-Cole**.

As we have done our best to discern God's will for our parish for the present and the future, we firmly believe she is the ideal person to lead and guide us as we move forward. We are particularly excited about Sarah's becoming our new worship leader and a member of our community. The Vestry will be working with Sarah to conclude final arrangements over the course of the next few weeks, and it is our hope that Sarah will be ready to assume her new role on or shortly after October 1.

We believe that Sarah truly displays the characteristics and experience we feel most accurately reflects the parish's collective needs and desires for leadership for the future. She is a warm, open, and thoughtful priest, easy to talk with, enthusiastic and vibrant, displays friendliness and warmth to everybody, and is an excellent listener and communicator.

She displays respect for Episcopal tradition and services, yet is open to fresh and creative ideas for services. She is reflective and thoughtful in prayer and encourages individual spiritual growth and learning opportunities. Her homilies are from the heart, theologically sound and Bible based, yet relevant to modern life and times, and of easy style and well prepared.

We believe she also will be a leader for us in encouraging membership growth and retention, inspiring and engaging lay leadership, effectively communicating with the parish and greater communities, and encouraging volunteer participation in the life of the parish and outreach.

Sarah has a B.A. degree in Classical Civilizations and Political Science (double major) from the University of Vermont, an M.A. in Theology from Ripon College, Oxford University, and an M.A. in Biblical Studies/New Testament from King's College, London. She has also studied at Episcopal Church School of the Pacific in Berkeley, California. She was ordained an Episcopal priest in June, 1996.

Her husband, The Rev. Adrian Robbins-Cole, was called in September, 2013 to be the new Rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Wellesley, Massachusetts. Sarah and Adrian have two teenage children, Will and Elizabeth.

Most recently Sarah was the Associate Rector (with her husband Adrian as Rector) at All Saints Episcopal Church, Peterborough, New Hampshire, and served there with him for nine years. Prior to that she and her husband lived in England, where Sarah had responsibilities variously as Assistant Curate at All Saints Church, West Dulwich in South London; Honorary Curate at Holy Cross Church, Surrey; and Head School Chaplain at King's College School, Wimbledon.

She has taught religious studies, directed Bible school, worked as youth group coordinator, led worship services, preached, was responsible for pastoral care - and coached rugby and soccer! She has also worked as fitness instructor, yoga and Pilates teacher, and aqua aerobics instructor. In addition, she has served successfully for a number of years on staff at the Barbara Harris Camp.

Her references were particularly laudable and included comments about her warm, friendly and welcoming manner, her outstanding preaching, and her positive and energetic spirit. They noted she is great with children and youth, open minded and positive, and easy to talk with, and has exceptional pastoral presence and skills.

We know you will join us in welcoming Sarah with the spirit that abounds in our community, and will do everything in your power to support her as she guides us as our new Rector.

### UPDATE FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

When we began 2014, the projection was to take \$14,269 from reserves to balance the budget. In April we reported that we had received pledge increase commitments and one-time contributions that increased our projected pledge income from \$115,806 to \$126,521, reducing the projected shortfall to \$3,554.

Through July, we have received more pledge increase commitments. Our pledge total is now \$128,000, and this means that the projected shortfall has been reduced to \$2,075!

Thanks to all that have made financial commitments that are vital to supporting the mission and ministry of St. Michael's.

## CHURCH SCHOOL: CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

We want to make our wonderful program, the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd*, accessible to all children at St. Michael's. We consider *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* to be outstanding, and the best formation in faith that we can offer our children.

The *Catechesis* program is designed to enable children to recognize and develop the experience of God that they already possess. It introduces the language, symbols and practices of worship as well as the stories of the Bible and Church history.

This program would not be possible without the remarkable commitment of our dedicated Church School teachers, who are in the atrium classrooms almost every Sunday of the school year. Since our volunteer Lead Teachers need assistance, we ask parents to volunteer. **We have flexible volunteer requirements and ask parents with one child to help in the classroom for at least four Sundays during the Church School year.** We hope that parents who have more than one child in *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* will volunteer more often. Depending upon what best fits your schedule, you may volunteer for consecutive Sundays or for staggered Sundays during the year.

If you cannot assist in the classroom on Sunday mornings, there are other ways you can help the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* program. While the program cannot exist without the help of parent volunteers, our first priority is the spiritual wellbeing of all children in our parish, including children whose parents may not be able to volunteer.

If circumstances prevent you from assisting in any way this year, we still encourage you to register your children for the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* program.



### Registration

Registration for Church School is available both by email and in person. Parents of returning Church School students may register by email ([stmichholl@aol.com](mailto:stmichholl@aol.com)) from August 31 onwards.



Registration for new Church School students will be held at St. Michael's on **Sunday, September 14 from 9:15 to 9:45 AM and from 11:15 AM onwards.**

Registration remains open throughout the school year. If your child is not yet ready to join *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* in September, he or she may join in the fall, winter, or spring. Even if your child misses a number of classes, all classes your children are able attend will help them benefit from the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* program.

### Catechesis Levels

In the **Level I Atrium** (for 3 to 6 year olds), The lead teacher in the atrium will be Karin Protas. This atrium is in the upstairs classroom at the front of the building.

The **Level II Atrium** (for children entering 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade) is in the Stephen Hagen Atrium downstairs. Mike Teuber will be the lead assistant this year, with help from Ken Rice.

The **Level III Atrium** (for children entering 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grades) meets in the upstairs classroom at the rear of the building, with Kristen Walters as lead teacher.

### Classes Begin on September 21

**The *Catechesis* program will begin on Sunday morning, September 21** in Levels I, II and III. Please make every effort to get your children to class on time. The time is necessary to cover the wealth of material and give the children time to work with the materials presented. Late arrivals can be disrupting to other children and the teachers.

## JOURNEY TO ADULTHOOD PROGRAMS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE



### Youth Sundays Worship

Our young people are an important part of the St. Michael's community – and their presence in worship enriches them and all of us. This year we plan exciting Youth Sundays, when young people in Rite-13 and J2A will not have classes but instead will participate in the Eucharist at 10 AM. This will provide a chance for those who wish to serve as ushers, greeters, lectors or Eucharistic Ministers. The sermon will aim to address issues of interest to teens as well as adults. Youth Sundays will usually take place on the first Sunday of every month, starting in October with Blessing of the Animals on October 5.

### Rite-13 for 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> grades

Our Rite-13 group will continue this September for young people in grades 6 and 7. Rite-13 is the first two-year phase of the Journey to Adulthood youth education program, widely recognized as an excellent program providing a Christian foundation for young people as they prepare for successful adulthood.

The Rite-13 group will meet from 9:45 to 10:40 on Sunday mornings. The Rite-13 program addresses four themes – self, society, spirituality, and sexuality – through Bible study, group discussions and special extra-curricular activities. Look for further information about Rite-13 at Celebration Sunday on September 14, including plans for the upcoming year.

### J2A for 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> grades

The J2A program covers the same type of topics as Rite-13 but offers opportunities for greater responsibility and independence. It includes service and fellowship activities. ## GREETERS AND WELCOMING MINISTRY

### We Need You!

Do you remember what it was like to walk through the doors of a new church on a Sunday morning? Did you feel welcomed, ignored, over welcomed? St. Michael's is a very welcoming community. People notice the stranger and introduce themselves; invite them to coffee hour and hopefully make them feel welcomed. The Christian Formation and Stewardship team (Dana Frye, Craig Miller and Ralph Stover) would like to see us take this one step further. We would like to reenergize the Greeters and Welcoming Ministry. We would like you to be part of this important ministry here at St. Michael's.

This ministry will be visible on Sunday morning before the 10 a.m. service to greet and give a warm welcome to the newcomer that walks through our door. Depending on the individual, couple or family, some may just want a warm welcome, others may want more. They may have questions, they may be unfamiliar with our Episcopal worship and if they would like, you could ask a parishioner to sit with them.

The warm, inviting welcome at the door is the first step to welcoming the stranger. We are asking the newly formed Greeters and Welcoming Ministry to:

*Maintain the welcoming cards and pencils in the pews, and make sure that the rector receives a copy of the filled-out card*

*Re-stock the welcoming gift bag that we give to each visitor or visiting family*

*Organize and host a twice yearly (Fall and Early Spring) social event where the newcomers can meet and talk with the vestry and other members of the community*

*Through the bulletin, newsletter and the weekly email that goes out to the parish communicate the dates and times for social events.*

If 16 people sign up, you would be asked to serve one Sunday every 2 months. Those 16 people could form teams to accomplish the above 4 goals. Once the ministry bags are stocked and the supplies kept in the closet in the Narthex, it would mean filling new bags and putting them out whenever necessary, and restocking possibly once a year. Parishioners are very generous when asked to provide something for a pot luck event for the parish so organizing, sending out invitations to the new people, getting volunteers to set up, clean up and bring food would be all that you would need to do.

Welcoming the stranger is wonderful but not enough. Integrating new people into the life of the community is very important. Helping them to find the appropriate place where they can share their gifts helps them to feel like an important member of the community. Please consider being part of this vital ministry. 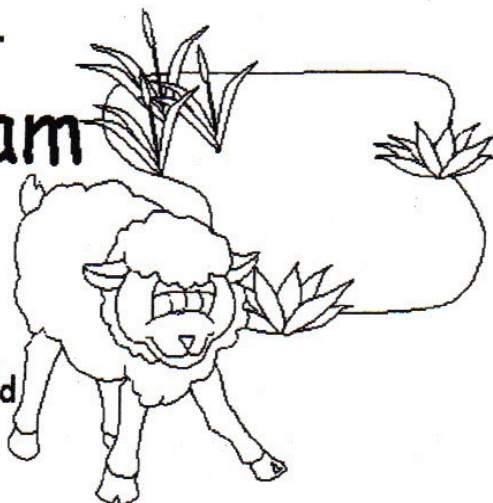

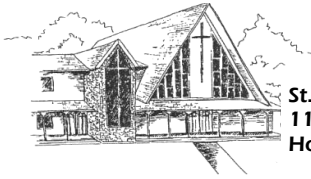
