# from the Interim Rector

"To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (1 Corinthians 12:7-14)

Happy New Year!!!

Next Sunday, St. Michael's will gather for their annual meeting. In addition to the regular business of the parish, the vestry invites all of us to gather after the meeting for lunch and to go deeper into one of the themes that came out of the information gathered by the search committee. It is the feeling of the vestry and search committee as well as others throughout our congregation that the one theme that is the most important to address at this time is: "More lay involvement (creative opportunities for shared tasks, sensitivity to time needs, helping with stewardship, fight the "burnout" factor)." As I said in my homily this past Sunday, there are two things that people consistently said to me when I first came to St. Michael's. One was how proud the parish is that every penny raised by the auction goes to outreach. This, in my opinion, is something that we should celebrate. It is a wonderful gospel ministry and you are to be commended for your effort and commitment to those less fortunate than ourselves. The other thing that people said was that it is so hard to get people to volunteer. People won't step forward because they are afraid that they won't get the support they need. You told me that the burn-out factor is a serious concern.

There are two VERY important reasons to address this now. One is that you are calling a ¾ time rector and second you want a "friend" or what I call a clergy companion. When the search committee is ready to interview candidates, they want to be able to have a meaningful conversation about what the parish is doing to address the "burn out" factor. The candidates will want to know what the parish is doing to address this concern so that parishioners can be companions in ministry with your new rector. The desire for a companion in ministry is a shared desire for both clergy and lay people.

The Annual Meeting is a good time to go deeper into this area of concern. The vestry wants to hear from you; what do you need from them in order for you to offer your gifts to the parish; what holds you back; how can

#### RECTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Rector Search Committee has now spent some time assembling and reviewing all responses received from parishioners who were invited to share thoughts and ideas about our church and community. In response to the several questions we asked, a number of themes arose in multiple responses. These key themes were reflected in several ways, but all pointed to the main ideas.

In addition to the major themes, we also received a number of other comments, suggestions, and observations, some of which were issues for vestry consideration, or to be considered once we name a new Rector. These have all either been forwarded as appropriate, or will be retained for further consideration. No comments have been ignored.

Below are outlined, with brief comment, the major themes that we identified.

# Things Personally Valued by Individuals

- \* Worship, Including music (specifically mentioned were dedicated and loyal choir and a creative music director)
- \* Welcoming atmosphere reflected in warm community and shared fellowship Outreach
- \* Inclusion of children in parish life

## Things Most Important to Us as a Parish

- \* Worship, including variety of services
- \* Outreach programs
- \* Welcoming atmosphere
- \* Fellowship opportunities
- \* And, to a lesser degree, children's programs and financial stability

#### Things We Do Particularly Well

- \* Outreach efforts (variety and response to needs)
- \* Welcoming atmosphere
- \* Fellowship
- \* Music
- \* Inclusion of children (specifically mentioned were youth education and very dedicated teachers and leaders

#### Things To Improve or Develop More Effectively

- \* More lay involvement (creative opportunities for shared tasks, sensitivity to time needs, helping with stewardship, fight the "burn-out" factor)
- \* Involving children (with recognition of youth participation in service responsibilities)
- \* Promotion/publicity (of communication and volunteer efforts within the parish, and information on our services

and contributions in the community; membership drives)

\* Continue strong effort in retaining membership and re-inviting those who leave, and in meeting and welcoming newcomers

## Most Important Characteristics of a New Rector

- \* Personable and approachable, welcoming and warm. "A Friend to us and our parish"
- \* Sermons Bible-based and theologically sound, but relates Gospel to today's life and times and personal needs.
- \* Respect Episcopal tradition (use of Book of Common Prayer), yet open, imaginative, and creative in offering different worship and services (jazz Eucharist, Lessons and Carols, Blessing of the Animals, Blue Christmas, etc.)
- \* Spiritual (prayerful) and Pastoral (comforting to those in need)
- \* Ability to relate well to and encourage children Children's sermons; youth groups, etc.)
- \* A Leader communicator, not procrastinator, guide staff, financially capable, motivator, understands stewardship

The next steps for the Search Committee will be to draft language that succinctly and faithfully captures and describes these themes in a Parish Profile. That Profile, once approved by the Diocese, will be made available or published in a number of sources, including our own and the Diocese websites, the national Office of Transition Ministry, and the Massachusetts Clergy Association and Diocese newsletters. Once completed and available, the Parish Profile will serve to begin the process of receiving names of candidates interested in our new Rector position.

If you have any questions or comments regarding this material or the search process, please feel free to contact any member of the Search Committee. We welcome and encourage your continued participation and assistance with this most important task.

#### **RECYCLING AT COFFEE HOUR**

Please take advantage of the recycling at coffee hour. Following the few guidelines will help tremendously in this effort. Signs are posted by each receptacle. When paper products and/or food are put in the liquid only bucket, it means the liquid cannot be used to water outdoor plants for many months of the year, and makes for a more difficult clean-up in the winter months. The food waste can be used for composting when it does not have paper products and liquid mixed in. 
