IF YOU WERE WONDERING . . .

The following FAQs respond to questions that parishioners frequently ask about pledging, our parish budget, etc.

What is St. Michael's annual pledge campaign?

The campaign, which begins in mid-October, invites us to give back to God in gratitude for all that God has given to us. It asks us to commit to give financially, as well as offering our time and skills, to support our church. We ask for pledges to be returned no later than All Saints' Sunday, November 2.

What is an annual giving pledge?

An annual giving pledge is a commitment to proportional giving over the course of the year which means looking at your pledge as a percentage of what you have been given by God. (see chart on back of pledge card.) The money is used to support the operating budget of the church, including paying for all expenses such as salaries for the rector, organist, secretary and sexton, utility bills, building upkeep, insurance, diocesan pledge, church school supplies, etc., as well as assisting in support for ministries such as music, outreach, children and youth, and fellowship.

Why should I pledge? Isn't putting money in the collection plate the same?

The importance of pledging, rather than putting money in the collection plate, is that pledging allows the vestry to plan the budget for the coming year. Church-wide pledging allows the vestry to act in a responsible way to the church's needs and priorities over the course of the year.

What happens if I make a pledge and then am unable to meet my pledge obligation?

We understand that circumstances may change significantly over the course of a year and make it impossible to fulfill a pledge promise. It is helpful if you notify the Rector so that income projections may be adjusted as necessary (without, of course, divulging the identity of the individual or household).

If St. Michael's receives money from pledges, as well as money put in the collection plate, why does the church need to hold fundraising events such as the Auction?

Pledge income provides only part of the operating

budget income. Two annual fundraisers are held to meet additional income needs. The Silent Auction proceeds are committed to supporting our hands-on outreach projects and Applefest Fall Fair proceeds go towards the operating budget.

Does St. Michael's have any additional sources of income?

St. Michael's is completely self-supporting; it does not receive any financial support from the diocese or any other Episcopal organizations. The great majority of church income for the parish derives from pledges and other donations. Additionally, about 12% of income is received from rental of the parish hall and other areas of the church building.

What is St. Michael's operating budget this year, and how much of that has been promised in stewardship pledges?

The operating budget (expenses) for 2014 is \$177,125. Of this, \$127,000.00 (70.6%) has been promised in stewardship pledges. The balance of the budget is planned to be met by special donations, plate collections, hall and space rental, fundraising.

How may I arrange to pay my pledge?

Your pledge may be paid by the week, month, quarter, or year. New pledges are always welcome at any time of the year, although most parishioners make their pledge at the time of the annual campaign in the fall, to allow the vestry to plan a budget for the coming year.

Do I have to use envelopes to pay my pledge?

No. We particularly welcome pledge payments made by regularly scheduled bank payments. Envelopes make it easier to count and record check and cash payments against pledges. Checks will be recorded as pledge payments (if received from a household that has pledged) whether in an envelope or not. Envelopes are available in early December for the coming year.

Are my pledge payments tax deductible?

St. Michael's Church is a tax-exempt organization, so contributions such as pledge payments are deductible from income tax in the year they are given, regardless of whether they are given for the current, past, or future calendar year. Pledges paid in 2014 for 2015 will be reserved for use for the 2015 budget.

ALL SAINTS SUNDAY – REMEMBERING THOSE WHO HAVE GONE BEFORE US

As part of our All Saints' Sunday celebration, Church School children build shrines (at the Mother's Altar and in the narthex) to honor the dead. We invite you to bring photographs of those you would like remembered and to write their names in a Book of Life that will be brought to the altar on All Saints' Sunday, November 2. Families are invited to make memorial cards for loved ones to be displayed at the shrines. Materials will be available in Eva''s room on October 26. A photograph is encouraged but not necessary. BAPTISMS ON ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY


